



THREE WAVES MOVEMENT

REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE THREE WAVES MOVEMENT DURING 2022 AND THE PROJECTED PLANS FOR 2023

The emphasis or the goal to reach during 2022 was to strengthen and to consolidate the networks and existing partnerships in each country. In 2023 the emphasis continues to be ***strengthen and consolidate the networks and existing partnerships in each country through training and discipleship of new leaders.***

Of the presented projects of 2022 the following activities were accomplished:

1. THE AMAZON CONSULTATION IN COLOMBIA.

The network of Amazonian indigenous leaders in Colombia was formed, this took place the 24 through 30 of July. It was attended by two hundred (200) Amazonian indigenous leaders representing six (6) departments of the country: Guainía, Vichada, Guaviare, Vaupés, Caquetá and Amazonas.

• Findings of the consulta

- ☞ The network of Christian indigenous leaders of the Colombian amazon “LICAC” was formed with 100% Amazonian members of fifteen (15) ethnic groups present in six departments of the country.
- ☞ The three waves movement played a major part in the achievement of the consultation.
- ☞ The presence of Amazonian indigenous women was nurtured and the first steps were taken to establish the association of indigenous women of the Colombian Amazon within LICAC, under the coordination of sister Solangy Gómez, Pastor Cesar Rodríguez’s wife.
- ☞ The Transamazonian network continues its consolidation process in South America by establishing a new network of Amazonian indigenous leaders.

2. CATALYTIC LEADERSHIP TRAINING WITH L555 IN PERU

It took place in the city of Pucallpa (Peru) from September 17 to 24 with the participation of twenty-five (25) key leaders, including twelve (12) indigenous, nine (9) mestizos and four (4) foreigners. This completed the second training with the platform L555 on catalytic leadership.

Topics relevant to the spiritual and intellectual formation of the key leadership were discussed and a joint effort was made to redefine some concepts of the movement such as mission, vision, objectives and values.

The concepts that were redefined were as follows:

See Amazonian and lowland indigenous churches, strengthened and faithful to the great commission.

☞ **Mission of the movement.**

Mobilize the Christian community, creating an atmosphere of unity, collaboration and training of catalytic leaders; accompany in the development of the indigenous church in the Amazon and lowlands in fulfilling the great commission.

☞ **Values of the movement.**

- ✓ Value the voice of the indigenous.
- ✓ Interdependence
- ✓ Interculturalism
- ✓ Collaboration
- ✓ Integrity.

3. VISIT OF THE DELEGATION OF THE TRANSAMAZONIAN NETWORK AND ETO TO RELENAP IN PERU

The visit was made and four (4) meetings were held with the indigenous leadership of the trans-Amazonian network from September 25 to 27. The topics discussed focused on strengthening RELENAP's leadership (men and women) and encouraging them to continue their work and development as a movement in Peru. RELENAP's entire board (six men) was present along with some of its advisers, their wives and other women (five in total) from the Peruvian Amazon.

From these meetings, some important issues for the future of the movement in Peru were defined, the RELENAP board was reorganized and the relationship with the partnership was strengthened.

4. VISITS BY THE COORDINATOR OF THE COLOMBIAN AMAZONIAN NETWORK TO THE REGIONS

Four (4) visits to the different regions that make up the Colombian amazon were made by Pastor Cesar Rodriguez in the months of January, March, May and June. During these visits, the objectives of LICAC and three waves movement were made known.

5. RELENAP BOARD MEETING IN PUCALLPA, PERU.

This meeting was held from March 7th through the 9th, with the purpose of planning the work with the directors of RELENAP and consolidate the work with the network board in Peru, also the next steps to be taken during this year 2023 were planned. The directors of RELENAP and the ADN consortium participated.

6. WOMEN'S TRIP TO INDIGENOUS CHURCHES IN PERU.

This project was developed throughout 2022 during the months of April, June, September and November. The purpose of these trips was to conduct some workshops and Bible studies in the churches located around Pucallpa to encourage and train indigenous women through workshops and Bible studies that would enable them to develop spiritually.

7. TRAINING OF AMAZONIAN LEADERS BY REGION IN PERU.

RELENAP's leadership visited the regions of the Peruvian Amazon to give training to the indigenous leaders of those regions and strengthen their education in different topics to continue the process of empowerment that takes place in this country.

8. TRANSAMAZONICA MEETING WITH RELIEP IN PARAGUAY

From October 7th to 9th, the third RELIEP national congress was held in Paraguay. The movement was represented by Brother Henrique Terena who actively participated as guest speaker, Brother Rafael Ahuanari for reasons of force majeure could not participate in the event. The TransAmazonica network leads the process of maintaining companionship and continuing to strengthen relations with the movement in Paraguay.

From the developments in 2022 by the movement we conclude that there are still networks and partnerships that need to be accompanied and strengthened, therefore we believe that in 2023 we must maintain the goal of: *Strengthen and consolidate existing networks and partnerships in each country through the training and discipleship of new leaders.*

PROJECT PLANS FOR THE YEAR 2023

In compliance with the goal proposed by the MTO, more than twenty eight activities are scheduled in the Amazonian countries of South America, including:

Legalization of Torre Fuerte in Bolivia	Formalize the legalization of Torre Fuerte before the state	Obtain the legal status of Torre Fuerte which allows it to legalize the properties where it currently operates and obtain the necessary resources that allow it to meet its objectives.
Short-Term Team Visit to Peru	Authentic Life Church Colorado	Disciple the first wave in a practical way on issues of interculturality and work together in advancing the work within the indigenous people of the Peruvian Amazon.

Also, during the year 2023 we will hold virtual and face-to-face meetings with ETO, the executive committee of ETO and ALTECO to evaluate the progress of the project plan, make the necessary adjustments and address unforeseen issues in the development of the vision.

To the extent of our possibilities as a movement we will participate in some invitations to international events where our presence is really necessary.
