GENERAL PROGRESS REPORT OF THE TRANS-AMAZONIAN NETWORK 2023

As a Transamazonian Network we direct our gratitude to God who indisputably allows us to participate as useful instruments in His hands within His plan of outreach to unreached souls and to promote the integral growth of the already established churches, especially in the indigenous amazonian and lowland context that is our central focus.

In this year 2023, we have been able to make progress in several aspects.

- 1. We have improved our conversations with executives of the Trans-Amazonian Network. One of the limitations we have is connectivity, but despite this limitation the presidents of the networks have made the effort to be in communication. We have held four (4) meetings by zoom 1 On February 10, we addressed the issue of improving internet connection and the need to develop a work plan each year. 2 On April 5, we met to review the work plans of each national network, and discussed the agenda for the meeting via zoom with the leaders of the Suriname Network. 3 On 17 May we met to receive the adjusted work plans of the national networks, and talked about the possibility of bringing together all the families of the national networks boards in 2024. 4 On May 29 we met to socialize with ETO the work plans of the national networks.
- 2. We have attended in person some key meetings of the national networks, this with the aim of understanding first hand their realities. 1 In February we were with the Colombia Network for a week, encouraging them in leadership and in the plans they have in their country. 2 I was visiting and supporting Jonathan Pifer's family in Ecuador, and seeing the possibility in the future of having an Indigenous Network in that country. We are not going to put any pressure on the possibility of having a network in Ecuador. We just wait as God works on this.
- 3. We have managed to establish formal dialogue (Via Zoom) with the Suriname Network and welcome it as a member of the Trans-Amazonian Network.

 From Chapada, in the facilities of AMI (in Brazil) via zoom we established connection and formal dialogue with the indigenous leaders of the Suriname Network and despite the difficulties of internet connection we were able to celebrate the arrival of the Suriname Network as a member of the Trans-Amazonian Network.
- 4. I have assisted in other important areas such as: The revision of the materials for the leadership training of the MTO and other areas of interest for the Amazonian and lowland indigenous leadership of South America.
